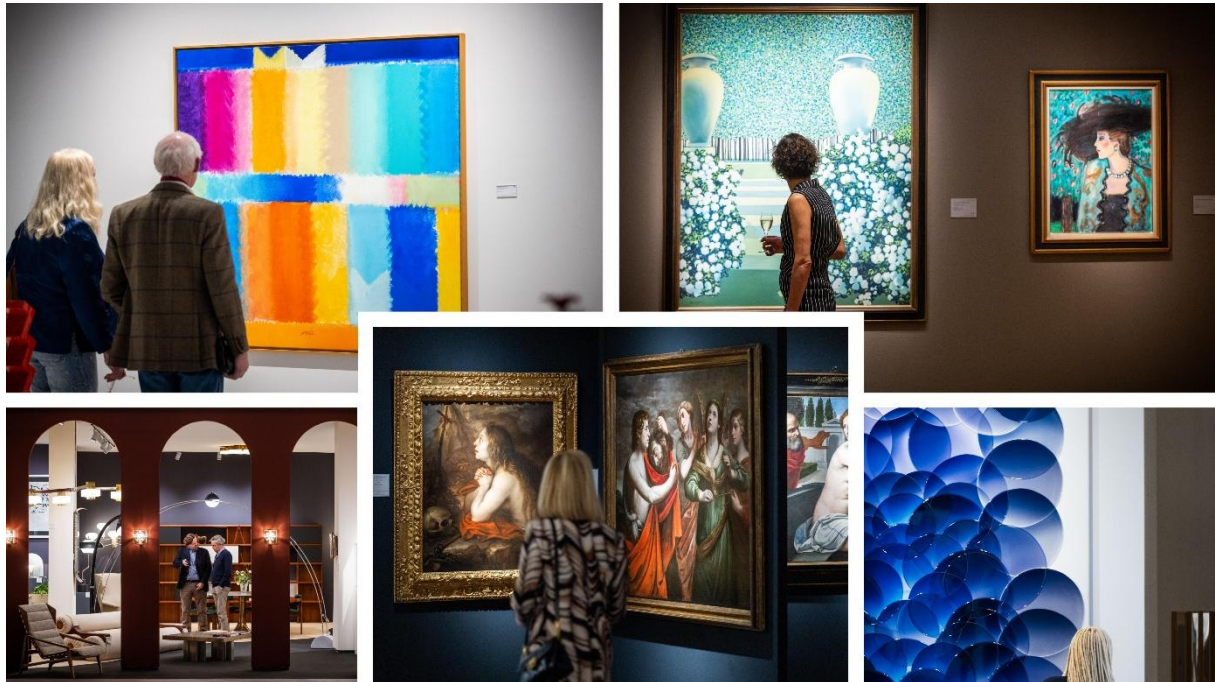

Thanks to our intensified focus on attracting leading international galleries, several renowned names from across the international art scene will take part in BRAFA for the first time. We have also succeeded in strengthening the Fair’s diversity, with a greater presence of Tribal Art, Old Masters and Design”, proudly announces Klaas Muller, Chairman of BRAFA.

With several months still to go before BRAFA 2027 opens, the exhibitor list is already complete: 150 exhibitors from 18 different countries.

This year, the selection process progressed at a particularly brisk pace, reflecting the Fair’s growing appeal and its increasingly prominent place on the international art-market calendar.

At the same time, BRAFA is delighted to welcome several prestigious new galleries and significant returning exhibitors, further strengthening its international profile and adding yet more diversity to the specialities represented.

Year after year, this momentum confirms BRAFA's position among the world's leading international general art fairs, while strengthening its role in the European art-market landscape as a trusted destination for collectors, institutions and enthusiasts, where established expertise meets fresh perspectives.

New exhibitors

Modern and contemporary art

Joining BRAFA for the first time is the London-based **Waddington Custot** (London, Paris, Dubai), renowned for its work with the Nabis masters, modern art, photorealism and contemporary creation, as well as **Stems Gallery** (Brussels), dedicated to emerging contemporary artists, with a particular focus on presenting the American scene to European audiences.

Asian art

Asian art will have a stronger presence at BRAFA through two Parisian galleries with a particular focus on Japanese art. **Galerie Tiago** will present a cabinet of curiosities devoted to the art of Japan, illustrating the richness and diversity of the country's creative output. Meanwhile, **Guillaume Castellano** will offer a selection of objects chosen for their aesthetic value, giving visitors two complementary approaches to this artistic world.

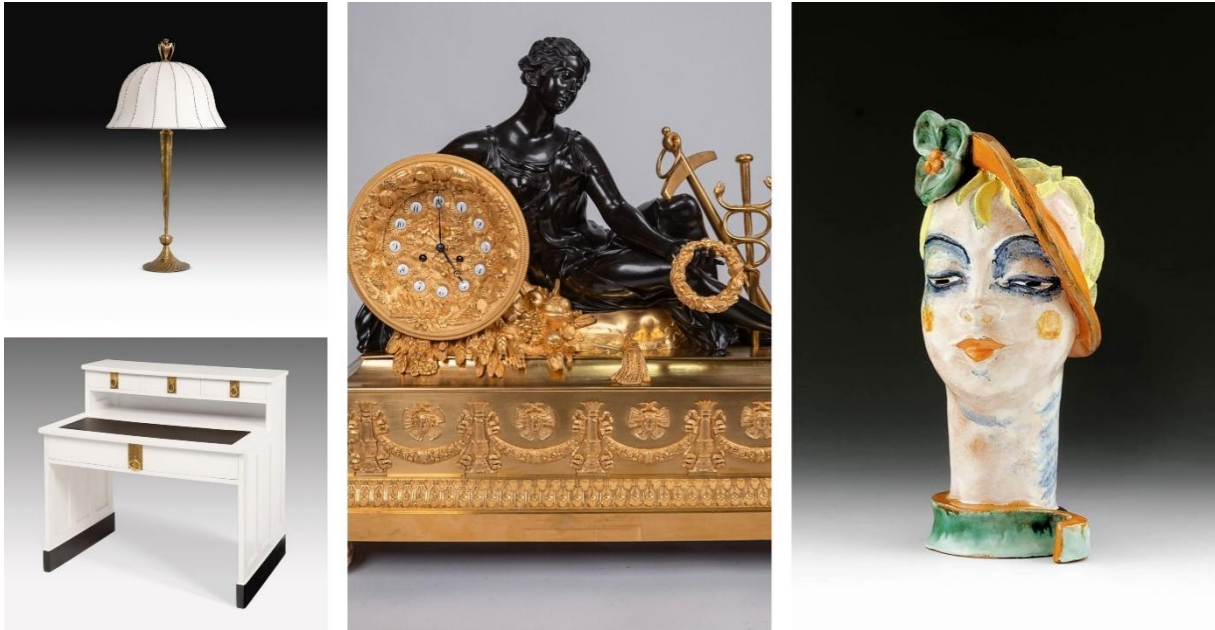
Old Masters

Three new names enrich the Old Masters offering: **W. Apolloni – Laocoon Gallery** (Rome/London), presenting paintings, drawings, sculptures and works of art from the 17th to the 19th century; **Argento Gallery** (NL), specialising in Dutch Golden Age masters, particularly 17th-century portraiture; and the Turin-based **Caretto & Occhinegro** (IT), with its discerning focus on Flemish, Dutch and German painting from the 15th to the 17th century.

Watches and jewellery

For the first time, BRAFA is opening its doors to vintage and prestige watches with the arrival of **Bernardini Milano** (IT), a specialist in high-end collectors' watches, thereby introducing a new field to the Fair. A new house also joins BRAFA's existing jewellery selection: **Marjan Sterk Fine Art Jewellery** (Amsterdam), specialising in signed antique and vintage jewellery.

Antiques, design and decorative arts are strengthened by several new galleries. **Verdini Antiques** (Rome), specialising in the selection of micro-mosaics, fine antique furniture and paintings by landscape artists depicting the *vedute* of Lazio; **Galerie bei der Albertina - Zetter** (Vienna), devoted to Austrian painting, sculpture and design of the 20th and 21st centuries, from Viennese Art Nouveau to the Wiener Werkstätte; **Spazio Nobile** (Brussels), dedicated to contemporary applied arts and collectible design; the Venetian house **Barovier&Toso**, which has perpetuated the craft of Murano blown glass since 1295; **Anthony Short Antiques** (Petworth), for period English furniture and decorative objects; and **Snackers Antiques & Fine Art** (Maastricht), specialising in religious art, antique furniture and collectors' objects.

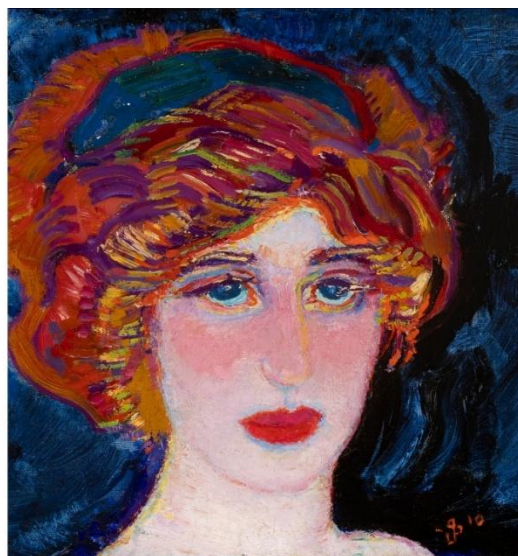
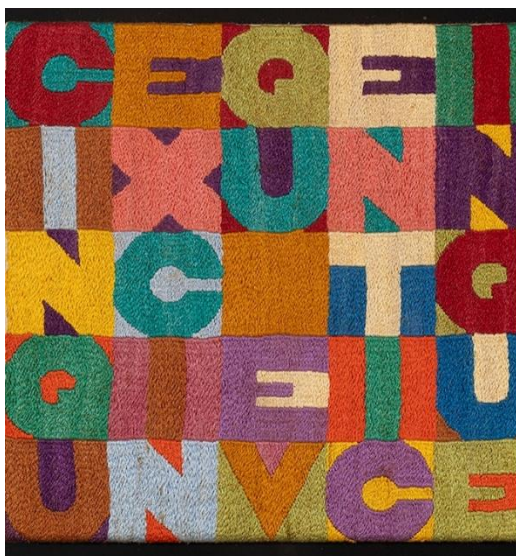

The return of leading names

Modern and contemporary art

Four galleries specialising in modern and contemporary art return to the Fair: **Stoppenbach & Delestre** (London/Paris), focusing on French artists associated with major movements such as the Barbizon School, Impressionism and Post-Impressionism, spanning the 19th century to the mid-20th century; **LUDORFF** (Düsseldorf), specialising in Impressionism and German Expressionism, post-war art and contemporary creation; **Opera Gallery** (Geneva), now present in 12 cities, with its selection of modern and contemporary art; and **Rueb Modern and Contemporary Art**, based in Amsterdam, which organises a major exhibition each year and benefits from an extensive network of private collectors.

Paintings, sculptures and works of art

They are joined by **Brun Fine Art** (Milan/Florence), with expertise in 18th-century Italian art, and **Galerie Uzal** (Brussels), presenting sculptures, paintings and works of art from the 19th and early 20th centuries. Finally, **F. Baulme Fine Arts** (FR), established on Quai Voltaire in Paris since 2014, presents European works of art from the 16th to the 19th century.

The Ixelles Museum, Guest of Honour at BRAFA 2027

For its 72nd edition, BRAFA will be delighted to welcome the Ixelles Museum as Guest of Honour. The Ixelles Museum will celebrate its reopening in March 2027, a pivotal moment following ten years of major renovation work.

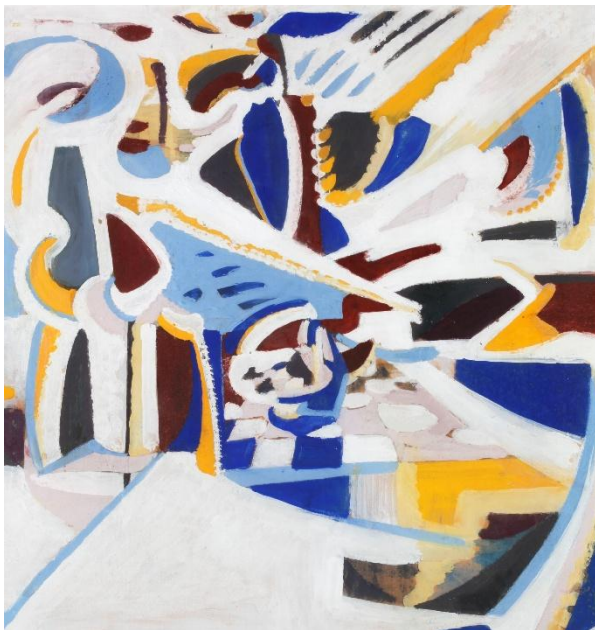
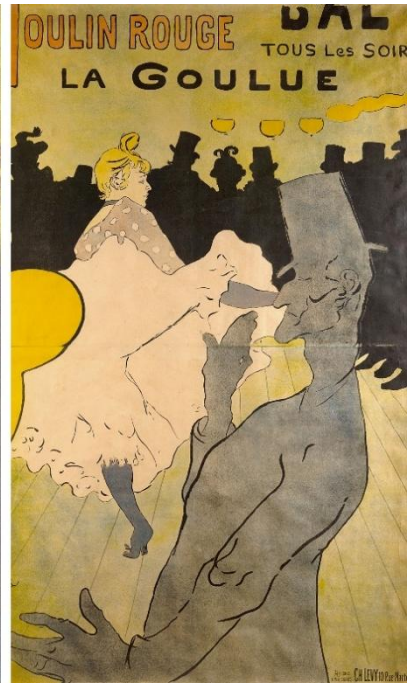
“To reopen is to connect: a rich past of nearly 135 years of artistic commitment with a present in motion; recognised heritage with living practices; and strong local roots with national and international perspectives. This reopening is a museum to be shared – a time to reunite with our loyal audiences and to forge new encounters: with new visitors, new generations, across disciplines, periods and viewpoints”, explains Claire Leblanc, Director-Curator of the Ixelles Museum.

Since its foundation, the museum has preserved, studied, enriched and shared a highly diverse collection devoted to Belgian art from the 19th century to the present day. Comprising nearly 15,000 works, it is now one of the major collections in this field. Beyond heritage, the museum has always supported the art of its time: many artists who were still emerging when their work entered the collection have since become leading figures – an attentiveness to living creation that continues to guide its acquisitions policy.

“We are particularly pleased to welcome the Ixelles Museum as Guest of Honour at BRAFA 2027,” says Klaas Muller, Chairman of BRAFA. “Beyond the quality and richness of its collection, we were especially drawn to its profoundly human vision of the museum and its desire to create connections between works, artists and audiences. BRAFA and the Ixelles Museum are two institutions of a different nature, but we share an essential conviction: art derives its full power from encounter and dialogue.”

This vision resonates with BRAFA’s own: beyond its international scale, the Fair remains above all a place for encounters, bringing together historic works and contemporary creations, decorative arts and design, as well as collectors, art lovers, professionals, journalists and visitors from every background.

The presence of the Ixelles Museum as Guest of Honour thus celebrates a history, a collection and a vision of a human-scale, forward-looking museum institution.

BRAFA can also be discovered beyond the works and stands through a rich programme of encounters, discoveries and experiences designed to extend and deepen the visit.

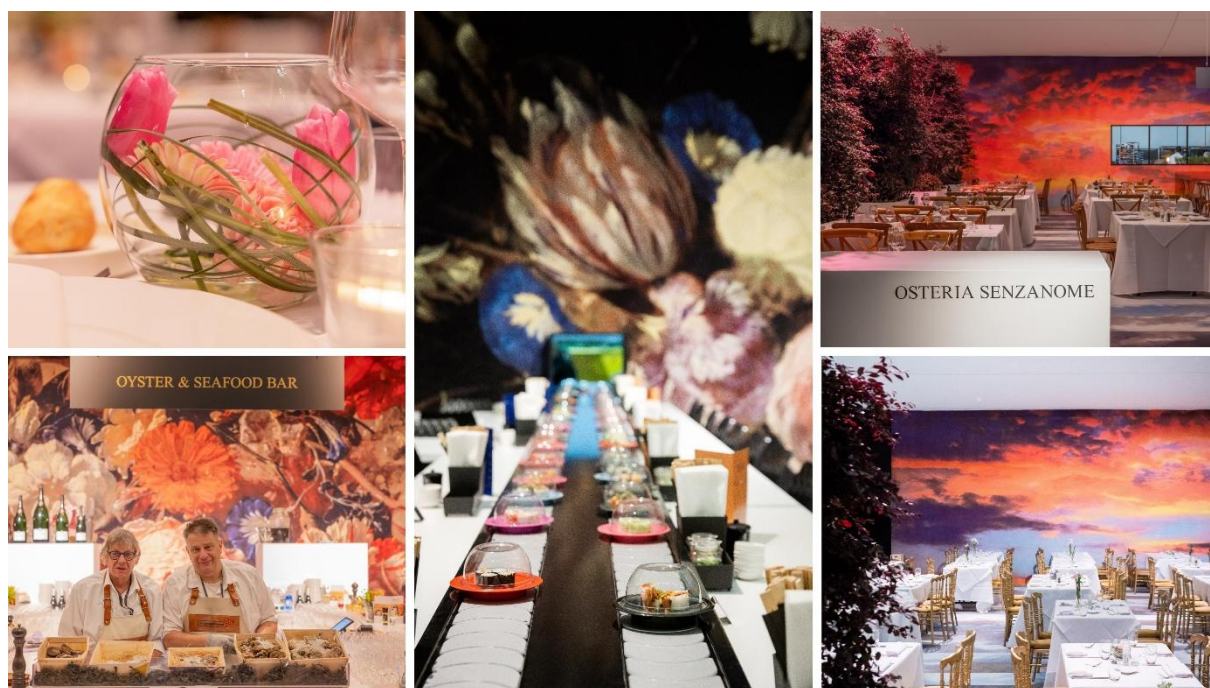
Throughout the Fair, visitors will be able to attend lectures and meet figures from the art world, discover the *KBF Art Talks* (a lecture series organised by the King Baudouin Foundation) and the *BRAFA Art Talks*, as well as take part in a series of short presentations devoted to works shown on the Ixelles Museum's stand and organised by the museum itself.

The programme will also offer original cultural experiences, including film screenings organised by the King Baudouin Foundation in collaboration with the Myriam Garfunkel Fund, as well as guided tours, Kids Tours and many other activities.

And because a day at BRAFA is also meant to be savoured, Hall 8, devoted entirely to dining and successfully inaugurated last year, will once again host several establishments, from the cuisine of chef Giovanni Bruno of *Senzanome* to the Oyster Bar, Sushi Bar and Brasserie.

Everything is in place to take time to browse, discover, exchange ideas, have lunch or pause over a drink – and, above all, to be surprised by everything BRAFA has to offer.

At BRAFA, a visit is far more than the discovery of works of art: it is an experience to live, share and savour.
