In this BRAFA Art Talk, Micha Leeflang will discuss the preparations for the exhibition entitled *From Antwerp to Amsterdam, sixteenth- and seventeenth-century painting*, which will be presented at the Museum Catharijneconvent in Utrecht from May 11<sup>th</sup> to September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Political and religious unrest in Antwerp caused a wave of migration of artists to the north, which created an unprecedented artistic emulation in Amsterdam, Leiden, Haarlem and Delft.


